1. What color are school buses: pink or yellow?

Answer: Yellow. Dr. Frank Cyr, a professor at Teacher's College, organized a conference in 1939 that established national school-bus standards and made yellow the go-to color. The doctor is known as the "Father of the Yellow School Bus."

2. What amphibians change their colors to blend into their surroundings: monkeys or chameleons?

Answer: Chameleons. Chameleons can see exactly 342 degrees around them, giving them an advantage over potential predators.

3. How many keys does a standard piano have: 49 or 88?

Answer: 88. The earliest forms of pianos date back to the 1700s. The modern piano has over 10,000 moving parts inside.
