1. From what direction does the sun rise: north or east?

Answer: East. The most brilliant sunrises are experienced on cloudy days because of how the clouds reflect the light.

2. Which of the following is a cleaning product: pine nuts or Pine Sol?

Answer: Pine Sol. Did you know B. J. Johnson invented the first liquid soap formula in 1898?

3. What is the black rubbery disc that hockey players hit with their sticks: a Frisbee or a puck?

Answer: A puck. A regulation hockey puck weighs between 5.5 and six ounces. **Fun fact:** In the Hockey Hall of Fame, the very first puck is on display—it is square.

4. If you purchase a pack of Doublemint, are you buying chocolate or gum?

Answer: Gum. Doublemint gum was the third flavor created by the company, and the advertising campaign featuring twins started in the 1950s.

5. Québec is a city located in what country: Germany or Canada?

Answer: Canada. The city is the oldest in Canada and is the capital of the Québec province.

6. What type of music is Beethoven known for: rock 'n' roll or classical?

Answer: Classical. Beethoven is considered one of the best composers of all time.

7. Which of the following is a type of hammer: Phillips-head or claw?

Answer: Claw. The use of hammers dates back more than three million years to the stone age. The average weight of hammers ranges from a few ounces to 15 pounds.

Answer: Dances. The foxtrot originated from vaudeville actor Harry Fox, who danced the steps to ragtime music in a New York theater.

11. Which of the following is something a person would wear on their wrist: a necklace or a bracelet?

Answer: A bracelet. **Fun fact:** The largest diamond in the world was discovered in 1905, weighing in at 3,106 carats.

12. Blacksmiths are known for their work using what material: wood or iron?

Answer: Iron. As a blacksmith bends and hammers the metal, it becomes harder. If the metal is hammered when it is already work-hardened, it will break.

13. How many seasons are there throughout the year: two or four?

Answer: Four. The different seasons cause many plants to go dormant and animals to migrate.
