(Questions with Answers)

1. What kitchen appliance cleans lots of dishes all at once: a blender or a dishwasher?

Answer: A dishwasher. Invented in 1850, the earliest dishwashers were hand-turned to splash water on the dishes. Modern electric versions were developed in the early 1900s.

2. Which animal is in the bird family: a cougar or a turkey?

Answer: Turkey. A male turkey is called a gobbler and can run up to 25 miles per hour.

3. Which of the following is a continent: Alaska or Asia?

Answer: Asia. Asia is the largest of all continents and home to the highest and lowest points in the world.

4. Italy is shaped like what kind of footwear: a sneaker or a boot?

Answer: A boot. Italy is home to varied scenic views, including the Alps and the Mediterranean Sea. It is also home to active volcanos.

5. Which type of egg dish is mixed with water or milk: over-easy or scrambled?

Answer: Scrambled. **Fun fact:** The largest egg is produced by the ostrich. One ostrich egg provides up to 24 servings.

6. Which type of bird can be trained to talk: pigeon or parrot?

Answer: Parrot. There are about 350 different species of parrot, some of which can live to be 60 years old.

7. When it comes to dice, what is the highest number on a regular die: two or six?

Answer: Six. Dice used in board games are machine-made and considered imperfect. However, the dice used in casinos are often handmade to ensure sharp, perfect edges.

8. What shape is a flag in the U.S. folded into before it is stored: a circle or a triangle?

Answer: A triangle. The flag is folded 13 times, with a different meaning for each fold. It is often presented to the family of a fallen soldier at a military funeral.

9. Which of the following is a green fruit: pumpkin or kiwi?

Answer: Kiwi. It is the only fruit that shares its name with a bird. It is the most nutrient-dense fruit.

10. How many suits are in a deck of playing cards: two or four?

Answer: Four. **Fun fact:** Decks of cards used in casinos are only in play for up to 12 hours based on how busy the table is and how shuffling is conducted to keep the cards from showing distinguishing marks.

11. Where do you go to send a letter: the mall or the post office?

Answer: The post office. Some famous celebrities were once employees of the United States Postal Service—including Walt Disney, Abraham Lincoln, and Bing Crosby.

12. What kind of hat does a construction worker wear: a fedora or a hard hat?

Answer: Hard hat. The first hard hats were utilized in the fields during World War I to combat the devastating effects of the automatic machine gun.

13. Finish the song lyric “The best things in life are _____”: blue or free.

Answer: Free. The saying is said to have come from Coco Chanel. The rest of the quote is, “The second-best things are very, very expensive.”

14. How many players are needed to play the card game bridge: seven or four?

Answer: Four. The game of bridge evolved from a card game from the 1890s called whist. In this game, a team of two players work together to win more tricks than the opposing team.

15. What type of boat is used to transport people and cars across smaller bodies of water: container ship or ferry?

Answer: Ferry. The longest-running ferry is found in Connecticut; it has been running since 1655.
