Rolling American Zip Codes

Roll the dice to try and match the numbers of a zip code.

Number of players: Any

Object of the game: Be the first player to cross off all the numbers of your chosen postal code.

Supplies:

- Printed copy of [Fun Zip Codes](#)
- Paper and pen or pencil for each player
- Two Dice



Directions:

1. Give each player a piece of paper and a pen or pencil.
2. Have each player select a Postal code from the list on the back of the page and write it down on their paper.
3. The first player rolls the dice. If they add up to one of the numbers in the zip code, the player crosses off that number.
 - Players may cross off only one single-digit number per turn.
 - If a player rolls a 10, they mark off the number 1.
 - A player must roll double 6s to mark off a 0.
4. Play moves clockwise, and the next player rolls the dice and marks off a number.
5. If a player can't mark off a number, they have to wait until their next turn to roll again.
6. The first player to mark off all their numbers wins.

FYI: The first numbers in a zip code (or postal code) indicate a geographic area. The second two numbers are more specific locations. The last two numbers are codes for post office locations. Zip codes with an additional four digits add more information. The first two numbers of the four digits indicate either a street or a building. The last two refer to either the floor of a large building or the side of the street the address is located.

Fun American Zip Codes

- The lowest zip code is **00501**, and it belongs to the IRS Processing Center in Holtsville, New York.
 - The highest zip code currently in use is in Ketchikan, Alaska—**99950**.
 - The U.S. president's zip code is **20500**.
 - Smokey Bear gets enough mail to merit a zip code: **20252**.
 - General Electric in Schenectady, New York, has a memorable zip code: **12345**.
 - The most expensive homes for sale last year were in Atherton, California. The zip code for Atherton is 94027. The second-most expensive homes were in Boston, Massachusetts, with zip code **02199**.
 - Disney World's zip code is **32836**.
 - Disneyland's zip code is **92802**.
 - Beverly Hills has the well-known zip code **90210**.
 - The Empire State Building's zip code is **10118**.
 - Lebanon, Kansas, the center of the continental United States, uses the zip code **66952**.
 - During 2021, people looked up homes for sale in Clarksville, Tennessee—**37042**—more than anywhere else.
