Answer: Dollar coin. Susan B. Anthony was the first woman to appear on a coin.

4. What artist is known for his covers of *The Saturday Evening Post*: Picasso or Norman Rockwell?

Answer: Norman Rockwell. Rockwell illustrated a total of 322 covers for *The Saturday Evening Post* over a 47-year span.

5. What color is a polar bear's fur: brown or white?

Answer: White. Polar bears can weigh as much as a grand piano, and they swim six miles per hour.
