(Questions with Answers)

1. What famous actress sang “Happy Birthday” to President Kennedy: Nancy Sinatra or Marilyn Monroe?

Answer: Marilyn Monroe. The dress worn by Marilyn Monroe in the minute-long performance was originally purchased for \$12,000 and auctioned off in 2016 for \$4.8 million dollars.

2. What outlaw’s nickname is Public Enemy Number 1: Al Pacino or John Dillinger?

Answer: John Dillinger. Dillinger was a notorious bank robber who pulled off several prison escapes between 1933–1934.

3. What element is used in balloons to make them float: hydrogen or helium?

Answer: Helium. Helium is the second-lightest element on the periodic table and the only gas that cannot be solidified by traditional cooling processes.

4. Which ocean animal has eight arms: eel or octopus?

Answer: Octopus. Octopuses not only have eight arms to move around but also three hearts to circulate blood.

5. Which boat is powered by paddles to move across the water: container ship or canoe?

Answer: Canoe. The canoe was one of the first kinds of boats, and it has long been used all around the world. There are three basic forms of canoe: bark canoe, skin canoe, and dugout canoe.

6. What is the primary ingredient in most baked goods: rice or flour?

Answer: Flour. Most flour is made from wheat. The Romans were the first to create flour by grinding wheat seeds.

7. Which football team did the great Vince Lombardi coach: the Dallas Cowboys or the Green Bay Packers?

Answer: The Green Bay Packers. In his time as head coach, Vince Lombardi led the Green Bay Packers to five NFL Championships and two Super Bowls. In 1971, Lombardi was inducted into the Pro Football Hall of Fame and had the Super Bowl trophy named in his honor.

8. What occupation is Frank Lloyd Wright known for: construction or architecture?

Answer: Architecture. Frank Lloyd Wright was also an avid car collector. The ramped design of his Guggenheim Museum in New York City was inspired by his love of cars.

9. Which American president is known for the saying, “The only thing we have to fear is fear itself”: John F. Kennedy or Franklin D. Roosevelt?

Answer: Franklin D. Roosevelt. In 1910, Roosevelt became the first sitting president to fly in an airplane.

10. What is the name of the cranky animated duck featured in Disney classics: Pluto or Donald?

Answer: Donald Duck. The voice of Donald Duck was performed by Clarence Nash from 1934 to 1983.

11. Which building would you visit to see varieties of fish and sea life: planetarium or aquarium?

Answer: Aquarium. The world's first aquarium was located at the London Zoo. It was called the Fish House and it opened in May 1853.

12. How many stars were on the original American flag: 10 or 13?

Answer: 13. The original flag from 1777 included 13 stars and 13 stripes to represent the original colonies. Since the first flag, there have been 27 versions. For every state added to the Union, a new star was added, while the number of stripes remained the same.

13. Which performer was a member of the Rat Pack: Paul McCartney or Dean Martin?

Answer: Dean Martin. Dean Martin recorded more than 100 albums and 600 songs. "Everybody Loves Somebody" topped the music charts in 1964, knocking out the Beatles from the No. 1 spot.

14. Which book was written by George Orwell: *Wuthering Heights* or *Animal Farm*?

Answer: *Animal Farm*. The book made Orwell famous. However, he initially had difficulty finding a publisher willing to publish the work. The book is a political fable based on the Russian Revolution.

15. Which type of plane has an open cockpit and two wings: jumbo jet or biplane?

Answer: Biplane. The first successful biplane was created in 1903 by the Wright brothers. On the plane's first flight, it remained airborne for 12 seconds.
