Horses

1. What is the name of the structure where a horse is kept: shed or stable?

Answer: Stable. The oldest stable was found in 1999 in Egypt. The stable was estimated to date back to between 1304 and 1237 BC.

2. What breed of horse is featured in Budweiser commercials: mustangs or Clydesdales?

Answer: Clydesdales. They are native to the country of Scotland and are often used as workhorses for heavy farm and industrial work.

3. What is the name of the person who rides racehorses: trainer or jockey?

Answer: Jockey. The average height of a jockey ranges between four feet 10 inches and five feet six inches. Former NBA player Manute Bol, who was a jockey for a charity race in Indiana, holds the record for the tallest jockey in history, standing at seven feet seven inches.

4. What famous horse race is held the first Saturday in May: the Belmont Stakes or the Kentucky Derby?

Answer: The Kentucky Derby. The Kentucky Derby is the most prestigious horse race, and it dates back to 1875. The fastest derby was completed in 1973 by Secretariat.

5. What is put on a horse to make riding more comfortable: reins or saddle?

Answer: Saddle. Saddles were developed between the third century BC and the first century AD. Before that, riders used blankets. There are two types of saddles: western and English. Western saddles are larger and heavier than English saddles.

6. What are placed on horses' hooves to prevent wear: a horse bag or horseshoes?

Answer: Horseshoes. Horseshoes are *U*-shaped pieces of metal attached to the bottom of a horse's hoof to prevent wear from hard or rough surfaces.

Answer: St. Louis. The Cardinals have a rich history and are one of the most successful franchises in MLB. They have won 11 World Series championships, with their most recent championship in 2011.

Answer: Canada. The Blue Jays call Toronto their home.

9. What baseball organization has won the most World Series: the Los Angeles Dodgers or the New York Yankees?

Answer: New York Yankees. As of 2024, they have won 27 World Series championships.

10. What team did Ted Williams play for: Milwaukee Brewers or Boston Red Sox?

Answer: Boston Red Sox. Ted Williams holds the record for the highest single-season batting average. He batted .406 in 1941.

11. What baseball team plays at Wrigley Field: Chicago White Sox or Chicago Cubs?

Answer: Chicago Cubs. Wrigley Field is the second-oldest stadium. It was built in 1914. Boston's Fenway Park is the oldest.

12. What is the name of Houston's Major League Baseball team: the Rangers or the Astros?

Answer: The Astros. The organization started in 1962 as the Houston Colt .45s. The name was changed to the Astros (as a nod to the home of the Johnson Space Center) in 1964.

13. How many hemispheres are there on Earth: three or four?

Answer: Four. They are the northern, southern, eastern, and western hemispheres. The equator divides the northern hemisphere from the southern, and the prime meridian divides the eastern and western hemispheres.
