1. What popular food condiment company is known for having 57 varieties: Hunt's or Heinz?

Answer: Heinz. The Heinz Company was founded in 1869 under the name of Anchor Pickle and Vinegar Works. Tomato ketchup was introduced in 1876 after the company's rebranding to the F. & J. Heinz Company.

2. Which popular topping is added to desserts: butter or whipped cream?

Answer: Whipped cream. Grad student Charles Getz invented spray whipped cream at the University of Illinois during the Depression.

3. Which topping traditionally goes on an ice cream sundae: cookies or a cherry?

Answer: A cherry. The maraschino cherry is used in cocktails and on ice cream sundaes. Its name is derived from marasca cherries and the maraschino liqueur made from them.

4. What condiment is made from pickles and goes on hot dogs: mustard or relish?

Answer: Relish. Relish originated in India and is an ingredient in many regional Indian dishes. In other countries, relish is used as a condiment, making it the best-selling condiment in the world.

5. Which is a popular pizza topping: sprinkles or pepperoni?

Answer: Pepperoni. The oldest pizza restaurant in the United States is Lombardi's in New York City. Originally a grocery store, Lombardi's began selling pizzas in 1905.

6. Which type of condiment is made by Hellmann's: steak sauce or mayonnaise?

Answer: Mayonnaise. A French chef created mayonnaise during the Seven Years' War. It is a whipped mixture of egg yolks and oil.

7. What piece of farm equipment is used to pull a wagon for hayrides: a combine or a tractor?

Answer: Tractor. The earliest tractors were made with steam engines. The first gas-powered tractor was made in 1892 in the state of Iowa.

8. What fall decorations are stuffed with hay: jack-o'-lanterns or scarecrows?

Answer: Scarecrows. Scarecrows were first used in Egypt to scare away quails. Ancient Greece followed by using statues of Greek gods as scarecrows.

9. Which produce items are judged at fall festivals for their size: cucumbers or pumpkins?

Answer: Pumpkins. A Minnesota gourd grower set the record for heaviest pumpkin in 2023. The pumpkin weighed in at an impressive 2,749 pounds (1,247 kg).

10. What animals were used to pull hayrides at early festivals: goats or horses?

Answer: Horses. Horses have lightning-fast reflexes, allowing them to go from standing to kicking in .3 seconds. Humans' reaction time, in comparison, is 1.6 seconds. Horses also have 10 muscles that control their ears, allowing them to move their ears 180 degrees.

11. Which genre of music is likely to be heard at fall festivals: R&B or country?

Answer: Country. English, Scottish, and Irish settlers brought the country music genre to North America. It was first broadcast on the radio in the 1920s.

12. What drink made from apples is a fall favorite served cold or warm: hot chocolate or cider?

Answer: Cider. Did you know that, in terms of history, it's only recently that we have begun to eat apples? Apples have a history of being too bitter to eat. Instead, they were pressed for their juice, which fermented into a delicious cider drink.
