1. Which of the following U.S. presidents had a beard: Ronald Reagan or Abraham Lincoln?

Answer: Abraham Lincoln. Abraham Lincoln is the only president to hold a patent. The patent was for a device that lifted boats over obstacles in the water.

2. What board game uses letter tiles with different point values: checkers or Scrabble?

Answer: Scrabble. Scrabble was originally known as Lexico and then Criss Cross Words.

3. Which U.S. state is home to Elvis' Graceland: Louisiana or Tennessee?

Answer: Tennessee. Graceland was purchased by Elvis Presley in 1957. In 1991, it was added to the National Register of Historic Places and became a National Historic Landmark in 2006.

4. What was the name Roy Rogers' famous horse: Mr. Ed or Trigger?

Answer: Trigger. Trigger had his own Dell comic book written about his adventures. He also made appearances at hospitals alongside Rogers to visit sick children.

5. What company made toy metal construction trucks for kids: Mattel or Tonka?

Answer: Tonka. The Tonka truck was first created in 1947 in the basement of a schoolhouse. In its first year, 37,000 trucks were made.

- 6. What is the longest bone in the human body: the tibia or the femur?

 Answer: Femur. The femur is in the human leg. In adults, femurs measure approximately 18 inches (46 cm) long.
- 7. What U.S. state is known as the "First State": Pennsylvania or Delaware?

 Answer: Delaware. Delaware was the first state to ratify the U.S. Constitution.
- 8. Which character is known for robbing the rich and giving to the poor: Peter Pan or Robin Hood?
 - **Answer:** Robin Hood. The story of Robin Hood dates to the 14th century.
- 9. Which of these birds does not fly: the hummingbird or the ostrich?

 Answer: Ostrich. The ostrich is the largest living bird on Earth.

A male ostrich can measure up to nine feet tall (2.7 m) and weigh over 300 pounds (136 kg).

10. Which holiday ends the Carnival season and is celebrated the day before Ash Wednesday: Chinese New Year or Mardi Gras?

Answer: Mardi Gras. *Mardi Gras* means "Fat Tuesday" in French. The first Mardi Gras celebration in America took place on March 3, 1699.

11. Which instrument was used during the American Revolutionary War to lead troops into battle: clarinet or snare drum?

Answer: Snare drum. Military use of the snare drum dates to the 14th century.

12. Which flower is traditionally given on Valentine's Day: water lilies or roses?

Answer: Roses. The oldest rose fossil dates to 35 million years ago. Currently, there are 150 different species of roses worldwide.

13. What clothing brand's slogan is "Just Do It": L.L. Bean or Nike?

Answer: Nike. The Nike brand was created in 1964. The company's turning point came in 1984 with the signing of Michael Jordan as a brand ambassador.

14. What is the name of the person who presides over court proceedings: the bailiff or the judge?

Answer: Judge. Most federal Judges are appointed to their positions for life. The president appoints the judges, and they are confirmed by the U.S. Senate.

15. What sport's athletes report for spring training at the end of February: football or baseball?

Answer: Baseball. Spring training dates to 1870, when the Cincinnati Red Stockings and the Chicago White Stockings held training camps in New Orleans.

16. What type of fish travels upstream to spawn: flounder or salmon?

Answer: Salmon. The largest Atlantic salmon on record weighed 105 pounds (48 kg). The average weight for a salmon is between 7–12 pounds (3–5 kg).
