#### **Ancient Worlds:**

1. How many wonders of the ancient world were there: two or seven?

**Answer:** Seven. The Great Pyramid of Giza is the only wonder of the ancient world still standing.

2. Which country is home to the world's longest wall: Germany or China?

**Answer:** China. The Great Wall is the largest structure built by humans. It was built over hundreds of years, beginning in the third century BC and completed in 1878.

3. Which of the following is Egyptian writing: logographic writing or hieroglyphs?

**Answer:** Hieroglyphs. Hieroglyphics were used to record history thousands of years ago, mostly in ancient tombs. A French scholar decrypted the pictures' meanings in 1822 by studying the Rosetta Stone.

4. Which Roman leader was assassinated on the Ides of March, or March 15, 44 BC: King Tut or Julius Caesar?

**Answer:** Julius Caesar. Julius Caesar was in power over the Roman Empire for one year before his assassination on March 15, 44 BC.

5. Which structure held ancient gladiator games: Stonehenge or the Colosseum?

**Answer:** The Colosseum. The Colosseum was finished in AD 80 and able to seat nearly 80,000 people.

6. Which actress played the Egyptian queen Cleopatra in the movie *Cleopatra*: Katharine Hepburn or Elizabeth Taylor?

**Answer:** Elizabeth Taylor. At the time of its release in 1963, *Cleopatra* was the most expensive movie ever made, with the budget growing to \$44 million.

7. Which country hosted the ancient Olympic Games: England or Greece?

**Answer:** Greece. In the ancient games, only the first-place winner was acknowledged and awarded a crown of olive, parsley, laurel, and pine.

8. What ancient counting tool was used for math: the calculator or the abacus?

**Answer:** The abacus. Different lines on the abacus stand for ones, 10s, 100s, etc.

9. What popular board game originated in India: Monopoly or chess?

**Answer:** Chess. The first chess pieces were divided like the military into infantry, cavalry, elephants, and chariots.

10. Which household pet was a sacred animal in Egypt: dogs or cats?

**Answer:** Cats. Egyptians believed cats were magical and would bring good luck to those who gave them a home.

11. Who was the longest-reigning British monarch: King Henry VIII or Oueen Elizabeth II?
