Animals

1. Which household pet is known for chasing mice: dogs or cats?

Answer: Cats. Cats are natural predators of small rodents, a behavior linked to their hunting instincts.

2. Which animal has a long trunk and big ears: a giraffe or an elephant?

Answer: Elephant. Elephants' trunks can hold up to two gallons (eight liters) of water.

3. Which animal moves slowly and carries a shell on its back: a hare or a turtle?

Answer: Turtle. A turtle's shell is part of its skeleton and grows with it.

4. Which animal is known for being able to mimic human speech: pigeons or parrots?

Answer: Parrots. Puck the parakeet holds the Guinness World Record for largest vocabulary for a bird, at 1,728 words.

5. Which African animal has stripes and resembles a horse: a donkey or a zebra?

Answer: Zebra. Zebras are members of the horse family, and scientists theorize that their stripes serve as camouflage and an insect deterrent.

6. Which animal native to China is black and white and eats bamboo: koala or panda?

Answer: Panda. Pandas consume between 26 and 84 pounds (11 to 38 kilograms) of bamboo daily.

7. Which animal's coat is used to make wool: cows or sheep?

Answer: Sheep. A single sheep provides nearly 10 pounds (4.5 kilograms) of wool per year. That is enough to make six sweaters, or enough fabric to cover a large couch.

8. Which animal lives in the ocean, has eight tentacles, and is very intelligent: a spider or an octopus?

Answer: Octopus. The octopus has three hearts. Two of the hearts work exclusively to move blood past the animal's gills, and the third circulates that oxygen-rich blood to the organs and muscles.

9. Which bird does not fly but is known for its speed on land: flamingo or ostrich?

Answer: Ostrich. The ostrich is able to cover 15 feet (five meters) in a single stride with its long legs and reach speeds of 44 miles per hour (70 kilometers per hour).

10. Which animal lives in the rainforest and swings from trees: sloth or monkey?

Answer: Monkey. Monkeys are able to solve complex problems and to learn from experience. They are also known for using tools.

Inventions

11. Which item keeps people dry during rainstorms: a cane or an umbrella?

Answer: Umbrella. Umbrellas have been around for thousands of years. They were often signs of royalty in ancient civilizations like the Egyptian, Assyrian, and Chinese, who used umbrellas to protect themselves from the sun.

12. Which invention allows shorter travel times between destinations by way of the air: bicycles or airplanes?

Answer: Airplanes. The first jet airliner, the de Havilland Comet, began passenger flights in 1952.

13. Which popular game in China is known for using tiles with dots and numbers: Scrabble or mah-jongg?

Answer: Mah-jongg. The name *mah-jongg* was coined and copyrighted by Joseph P. Babcock, an American resident of Shanghai, who is credited with introducing the game to the West after World War I.

14. Which household item has arms and tells time: a toaster or a clock?

Answer: A clock. The most accurate clocks in the world are atomic clocks.
