1. Which sport uses the terms *freestyle*, *butterfly*, and *false start*: track and field or swimming?

**Answer:** Swimming. An Olympic swimming pool is 50 meters long.

**Answer:** Twenty-one. Blackjack has been called twenty-one since the 1700s and became popular in American casinos in the early 1900s.
